Greenville County continues to meet the highest standards of financial reporting and I am honored to share this information with you – the citizens we proudly serve.





The County administered a program that provided nearly \$16 million in direct rental and utility assistance to citizens facing financial hardship related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

About Greenville County





Summary of **Financial Information**

The County's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report is presented in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). The presentation of this report differs from GAAP because the data presented is only for the primary government which includes all Greenville County governmental functions. The Greenville County Redevelopment Authority, the Greenville Area Development Corporation and the Greenville County Library System are excluded.

Governmental activities of Greenville County include the general government, public safety, highways and streets, economic development, judicial services, health and welfare, and culture and recreation. Governmental activities generally are financed through taxes and intergovernmental revenues.

Business-type activities include solid waste disposal, storm water quality and control, and the parking facility. These activities are intended to recover all or a significant portion of their costs through user fees and charges.

Balance Sheet

More formally referred to as the Statement of Net Position, the balance sheet reflects Greenville County's strong financial position. The consumption or acquisition of net assets that applies to a future reporting period are called deferred outflows of resources and deferred inflows of resources, respectively.

Explanations of Major Fluctuations

The decrease in net position for the governmental activities is primarily due to an increase in long-term liabilities. The County issued the second of three installment purchase revenue bonds used to finance the construction and renovation of several County office buildings. Capital assets increased due to construction and renovation of the County administration building and other facilities. In addition to the construction financing, long-term liabilities also increased due to an increase in the pension liability. The decrease in business-type activities net position is due to an increase in the liability related to the landfill closure and post-closure and pension liabilities.



Greenville County is the first in the state to implement "watergoat" technology to keep our water ways clean. The barrier system uses buoyed netting to prevent trash from traveling from roadways into waterways while still allowing marine life to pass.

Explanations of **Financial Information**

The increase in expenses for governmental activities is due to an increase in public safety and law enforcement salary and wages and corresponding related benefits, as well as, an increase in expenditures related to pandemic relief. Program revenues increased due to consumer spending due to continued expansion in the local economy. Further, the increase in operating grants and contributions is related to the County receiving federal funding for pandemic relief. The decrease in expenses for the business-type activities is due to a decrease in the landfill closure/post-closure annual expense. The increase in charges for services for the business-type activities is also due to an increase in fees and charges.


