Current to this date juveniles held in custody in Greenville County are held inside an adult county jail, in a portion of the building classified as a Type VI Juvenile Holdover Facility, a violation to the Federal Removal Mandate. The State of South Carolina continues to be penalized through the loss of grant funding because juveniles, though temporary, are housed in the same facility as adult inmates. The Type VI facility is operating under approved South Carolina Standards. Unfortunately this system of confinement further complicates the life style of juvenile detainees as they must be removed from the county facility within 48 hours of confinement less weekends and holidays. This requires the juveniles to be transported to Columbia and returned for required court hearings. Juveniles are thus often restricted from benefits and entitlements such as family visits because they are in transit mode

Greenville County, in cooperation with the SC Department of Juvenile Justice, has initiated a project to transform the Greenville Work Release Facility, a stand alone structure separate from the County Adult Detention Center, and displace the occupants into the Adult Detention Center. The building is currently under renovation to become a joint Type VII secure Juvenile Detention Center and a Type VIII non-secure Juvenile Community Residential Facility for the temporary holding of juveniles for further placement outside a secure Juvenile Detention Center.

The Type VIII section of the facility will be jointly occupied by several SC State Agencies to include the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ); the Department of Social Services (DSS); the Department of Alcohol and Other Abuse Services (DAODAS); and the Department of Mental Health (DMH). Mental Health Services are provided through a program at the Greenville County Detention Center where in-kind services could be provided; therefore there may not be a need for DMH presence.

It remains the vision of Director Barber, DJJ, and Greenville County, to establish a "One Stop Facility" program to work with incarcerated juveniles prior to conviction and placement with interaction by these agencies and families.

Salary and benefit funding is requested for five new FTEs of security staff. This will represent only a small portion of staff needed. Management staff and other security staff will be provided by Greenville County. All renovation expenses are bore by Greenville County. The facility renovation is scheduled for completion on October 1, 2013, with five months remaining in the grant period. Funding is requested for six months of the grant period to allow for required training prior to operation startup.
