a. General Description: <u>Gateway Park is located in the heart of Travelers Rest.</u> <u>Perfectly positioned between the thriving business district, the library, the high school and</u> <u>neighborhoods, Gateway Park is TR's "town center park" with active youth sports</u> <u>programs, tennis courts used by instructors, home of the "family picnic" after the Swamp</u> <u>Rabbit 5k run, which has over 5000 participants annually, and the recent addition of the</u> <u>mountain bike skills park and trails, Gateway Park is a destination park in the northern park</u> <u>of Greenville County. In addition, Gateway Park is a popular starting point for people using</u> <u>the Swamp Rabbit trail. This project will support installation of informational kiosks and</u> <u>signage to improve visitor enjoyment of the park and Travelers Rest.</u>

 Benefit project will provide the Community: <u>Public parks are community</u> <u>meeting spaces, places where you get to know your neighbor, places where</u> <u>everyone can be active, places that draw business development and</u> <u>community vibrancy. Greenville Rec recently added to the opportunities to</u> <u>enjoy the park by building over 1.25 miles of mountain bike skills and trails in</u> <u>the previously unused areas of the park. Kiosks and signage will help visitors</u> <u>fully enjoy the park including this new feature at the Gateway, while at the</u> <u>same time providing opportunites to promote community events and</u> <u>encouraging park visitors to explore businesses and other places in Travelers</u> <u>Rest, all of which will have a direct economic impact on the community.</u>

c. Additional Comments: <u>Walking and biking are the most popular recreational</u> <u>activities. Both activities are "lifetime activities", meaning they are healthy activities that</u> <u>everyone can do in varying capacities throughout their lifetimes with biking being</u> <u>something you can do even when you can no longer walk. The addition of the mountain bike</u> <u>skills park and the trails provides for both of these lifetime, healthy activities.
