The Military Order of the Purple Heart Upstate Chapter (#845) was 90 members strong and was active in the community in many ways including helping to raise awareness of qualified veterans of the benefits of the Purple Heart and supporting Greenville County's new Veterans Affairs clinic. Greenville County Council unanimously, and with great pride, declared Greenville County to be a Purple Heart County, and recognized those outstanding citizens of the County who for more than 230 years had served the nation in its times of need. He thanked the recipients of the Purple Heart and their families, and affirmed that the legacy of those heroes was forever honored and appreciated by Greenville County Council and its citizens.

Councilor Baldwin stated although it took a long time he appreciated the residents working together to bring costs down.

ACTION:

Councilor Kirven moved to allow amendments at third reading.

Motion to allow amendments at third reading carried unanimously.

Councilor Gibson stated Greenville Technical College had come a long way. She stated the addition was needed for the community. She asked everyone to vote in favor of the proposed.

Chairman Taylor stated financing options were discussed that would allow a lesser tax increase, if any. He stated if passed, the proposed item would be sent back to the Finance Committee to discuss the financing procedure.

Councilor Burns stated after discussions held earlier in the day, he felt there may be a way to use \$25 million of existing millage to move forward with the project. He was still hopeful to have a financial commitment from the state and the school board to assist with the project. He stated he spoke with several state legislative representatives and everyone wanted to work together.

Councilor Kirven asked if holding the item on the floor for discussion rather than sending it back to the Finance Committee was a better idea.

Chairman Taylor suggested having a workshop to discuss the item in detail.

Mr. Kernell suggested holding a special meeting the following week.

Councilor Kirven recommended voting on the item for second reading and then forward the item to a Committee of the Whole Special Meeting for the following week.

Councilor Burns stated the suggested financing included certain bond issuances that would be paid off in the near future, which would free up funds to disburse towards the project.

ACTION:

Councilor Burns moved to approve this item at second reading and refer the item to a Committee of the Whole Special Meeting to be held on Monday, August 26, 2013 at 6:00 p.m.

Councilor Rawls move to allow amendments at third reading.

Councilor Dill stated it was important to explain how the transfer would affect tax payers.

Mr. Kernell stated the proposed would transfer the current debt of the County Recreation District to Greenville County. He stated it was for the purpose of transferring the name.

Councilor Kirven asked if the comment made by a speaker earlier in the evening, in relation to a tax increase because of the County Recreation District, was a mistake.

Mr. Kernell stated it was a mistake.

Councilor Baldwin stated some citizens would help pay for a debt they did not incur.

Mr. Kernell stated municipality residents would help fund some of the debt incurred by the County Recreation District.

Motion to allow amendments at third reading carried unanimously.

Councilor Dill stated over the years, through annexation, the City of Greer had taken away funds from the County Recreation District.

Councilor Payne called for the question.

Motion as amended carried with Councilor Baldwin in opposition.

(g) Duncan Chapel Fire District / General Obligation Bond

ACTION:

Councilor Meadows moved for approval at second reading an ordinance finding that Duncan Chapel Fire District may conditionally issue not exceeding \$1,500,000 General Obligation Bonds; to authorize the Board of Fire Control of Duncan Chapel Fire District to issue such bonds and to provide for the publication of notice of the said findings and authorization; and other matters relating thereto.

Councilor Meadows stated the purpose of the vote was to issue bonds if the referendum passed.

ACTION:

On behalf of the district residents, Councilor Dill moved to hold the item until the next meeting to allow negotiations to be made between Travelers Rest and Duncan Chapel to determine the disposition of exactly which residents would vote in the Duncan Chapel Fire District area.

Councilor Dill stated he spoke with the City of Travelers Rest City Administrator and received a document from the City of Travelers Rest Attorney, that on July 4, 2013, the residents who were annexed into the City of Travelers Rest were notified by letter that Duncan Chapel Fire District would continue to serve those properties.

Motion to hold carried.

Councilor Baldwin asked when was the deadline to advertise a proposed November election.

Mr. Tollison stated in order to meet the advertising requirements, the proposed item was published on October 15th. He informed County Council he felt it would not cause an issue if they voted to hold the proposed item for two weeks.

Councilor Norris stated most of the individuals in Beyond Differences had a 3.0 GPA or better and she agreed with forming a youth commission.

Councilor Gibson congratulated Mr. Paul Guy and Rev. Donald Smith for the formulation of Beyond Differences.

Chairman Taylor stated he would research possibilities and bring the group back.

CU-ICAR, Oak Ridge National Lab, Cisco, Toyota and other corporate partners would be utilizing the SCTAC facilities over the next three years for the groundbreaking initiative.
