

Dear Mr. Cates,

In 2006, Renewable Water Resources f/k/a Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority was appointed Trustee of the Paris Mountain Wastewater Treatment Facility by the courts for the benefit of the residents of Paris Mountain. The agency was given support that assisted in initial improvements that allowed for bringing the small package plant serving the residents into design standards. However, it cost an additional amount of \$16,930 to maintain and operate the facility, the majority of which occurred during startup of the operation.

A flat fee of \$66.17 per resident was established with the assumption that they would cover ReWa's operational costs; however, this has not been the case. Currently, rates are meeting operational costs but the initial \$16,930 still exists.

Renewable Water Resources would greatly appreciate Greenville County's assistance in paying all or a portion of this deficit.
