County Administrator Joe Kernell stated the state-owned Hampton Avenue Bridge was closed in 1994. He stated the bridge spanned across a number of railroad tracks and from all indications, the railroad does not want a vehicular bridge over their tracks. Mr. Kernell stated the County was currently working with the railroad in regards to a pedestrian bridge and there would be a meeting with SCDOT the following week to discuss the project. He stated he was currently trying to secure the funding for the project and would be updating Council on the results of the meeting.
