These improvements to Perimeter Road will result in a wider and safer access to all the companies in SCTAC. This high profile piece of infrastructure is critical in attracting new companies to the area.

Performance Measurement:

Outputs: This project would completely reclaim/resurface a 2.45 mile section of Perimeter Road to provide a safer and more durable road to withstand the current and future demands of the center.

Outcomes: SCTAC has an annual economic impact of \$1.4 billion. The 85 companies depend on Perimeter Road to supply their operations and bring more than 3800 employees to work each day. With more than 600 acres of land still left to develop, a reclaimed/resurfaced Perimeter road will ensure prospective companies that SCTAC is committed to providing more than adequate infrastructure to support future growth. - a) The project will reclaim/resurface a section of Perimeter Road to retain the 85 companies that reside in SCTAC and attract additional investment from new industries.
- b) The South Carolina Technology & Aviation Center (SCTAC) is jointly owned by the City and County of Greenville. SCTAC is home to over 85 corporate tenants, including Lockheed Martin, 3M, Michelin and Cytec. Constructed in the 1940s, Perimeter Road was built as the main supply route to the 2600 acre Center. An improved Perimeter Road will help retain the existing companies and significantly increase marketability of the city and county owned Center.
- c) This project will reclaim/resurface a 2.45 mile section of Perimeter Road. The road will be reconstruct to today's standard of 28 feet to handle today's truck and industrial demands. 3) Relation to Other Local/Regional Activities

The significant improvement of this vital road will increase the marketability of SCTAC. This project directly relates to the goals of the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for the Appalachian Region of South Carolina prepared by the South Carolina Appalachian Council of Governments (SCACOG) in consultation with the counties in the region, including Greenville County. One of the goals identified in the CEDS is "Make the SCACOG region attractive for economic development by enhancing and sustaining infrastructure".

5) Benefits and Performance Measures —

- a) State outputs and outcomes in absolute numerical terms per ARC's Performance Measurement Guidelines. This project would reconstruct a 2.45 mile section of Perimeter Road to provide a safer and more durable road to withstand the current and future demands of the center. Perimeter Road was constructed by the Military in the 1940s to meet the needs of the air base. In 1964 the city and county of Greenville purchased the 2600 acres to develop into an industrial park.
- b) This 7 mile road has been supporting the needs of the Center for the past 49 years. From an economic development perspective, all prospective companies travel Perimeter Road when touring SCTAC. This improvement to one of the most important parts of our infrastructure will increase the marketability of SCTAC for years to come.

SCTAC needs funding assistance to upgrade a 2.45 mile section of Perimeter Road. Even though SCTAC is jointly owned by the City and County of Greenville, we receive no appropriation or millage from either entity. We have no taxing authority—we rely solely on our annual lease revenues for all operating and capital expenses. Over the last four years, we have reduced our staff from 14 to 7 full time employees in order to cut expenses and be as efficient as possible. In addition, we have utilized our bonding capacity to fund several major capital projects, but at this time we have no additional capacity to issue

bonds to finance new projects. Our budget has decreased over the last three years as we strive to do more with less. SCTAC has received commitments from Greenville County and the Greenville County Legislative Delegation in the amount of \$2,550,000 to complete the remaining 4.75 miles of Perimeter Road. The funds received from this request will enable the entire 7.2 mile road to be completed.

The combination of the factors above necessitate the creation of partnerships in order to grow the economic impact of SCTAC. SCTAC and ARC have enjoyed a successful partnership for many years which has resulted in job growth and wealth creation for the citizens of South Carolina. This current project will dramatically increase the marketability of facilities owned by the City and County of Greenville and managed by SCTAC.



At the March 28, 2013 GLDTC meeting you presented a project on behalf of STCAC. It is designated as GLDTC request C-474 for the rehabilitation/widening of Perimeter road (7.22 miles). The road is 51.2% SCDOT and 48.5% Greenville County owned.

The committee was asked to approve 50% (\$1,800,000.00) of the total project cost (\$3,600,000.00). After your presentation and subsequent discussion, the GLDTC approved \$1,800,000.00 for the project with the caveats' that SCTAC come up with the \$1,800,000.00 balance by the end on November 2013 and CoTransCo LLC, (the GLDTC Program Manager) manage the project. On motion by Dozier Brooks and second by Jason Elliott the committee voted unanimously to approve the motion and project.
