We're growing...

The Governor's School is expanding for the first time in its 14-year history with the addition of the new **Visitor's Center** at the entrance to campus. Construction of this two-story building is underway as it begins to fill the only unoccupied land on the school's 8.5-acre campus.

The street level of the structure will serve as a visitor's center for campus guests, and will also house offices for Admissions, Enrollment and Outreach, and the Foundation. The terrace level will house a print and design center for the Marketing Department, much-needed storage space for the Dance Department's costume collection, and additional office space. The state legislature has allocated \$1.25 million to support this capital improvement project, but after careful review, the School Board approved a \$1 million budget increase to allow for completion of the terrace level. The Foundation is supporting this budget increase through its Capital Campaign.

Visitor's Center FAQs

When will the building be completed? The Visitor's Center is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2014.

What is the size of the new Visitor's Center? It will be 11,413 pquare feet and will encompass 2 levels. In addition to office space, it will have a conference room and the lobby will also serve as a gallery that will house the school's permanent art collection.

Is the Alumni Walkway limited to SCGSAH alumni only? No. The walkway is dedicated to Governor's School alumni, but brick purchases are open to friends of the school, faculty, and staff, as well as alumni of all programs including summer and high school.

What will be housed on the street level? In addition to office space for the Foundation, the Admissions Department, and the Enrollment and Outreach Department, there will also be a conference room and a lobby which will house a permanent art collection.

What will the new lobby look like?
Below are architectural renderings of the entrance, lobby, and conference room.

Why are the Foundation and Enrollment/
Outreach offices moving to this space?
The Foundation office is currently located in the Visual Arts wing and their move will open up space for a new Animation Studio. The Enrollment/Outreach offices are currently located in the Academic building and their space will be renovated to become additional classrooms.

What other offices will be housed in the new Visitor's Center? The Graphic Design office, currently located in the arts building, will relocate to the Visitor's Center and expand to be ome a full-scale print shop. The current Graphic Design office will be renovated to become a Creative Writing classroom. There will also be space in the Visitor's Center dedicated to costume storage in a climate-controlled environment.

What is the GSA Foundation's fundraising goal for the Visitor's Center Capital Campaign? The GSA Foundation is seeking contributions totaling \$1 million to support the construction of the Visitor's Center. This is in addition to the state's allocation of \$1.25 million.
