1. Please describe any businesses or structures which require special equipment or represent potentially dangerous calls.

In Tigerville Fire district we have 2 Elementary schools and a University. All three of these represent an equal potential for dangerous calls, as they are the most densely populated areas in our district. While the Elementary schools are under normal grade school hours the University houses students year around. With an average daily population of 2500 people including staff we find ourselves responsible for them in all aspects of the daily activities both on campus and off.

2. Please list any mutual aid agreements or operational or resource sharing agreements your district participates in with other fire districts.

Tigerville Fire Department is a member of the Greenville county wide mutual aid agreement. Tigerville has also entered into automatic aid agreements with Glassy Mountain Fire Department, Lake Cunningham Fire Department, and Slater Marietta Fire Department in order to increase fire protection response to our community and theirs while also aiding in decreasing ISO ratings.

3. Please describe how, if at all, the requested millage increase will impact your district's ISO ratings.

Given we have requested to be placed on the schedule for a new ISO rating review we are confident with the changes implemented over the past four years that we have lowered our current rating, and with this millage increase it would aid us in our continuing effort to not only maintain our current rating but look to continuously improve our services to our community.

Tigerville fire Department covers the following:

North Greenville University: We provide fire protection, Medical First Response and Rescue, Fire Prevention classes, Fire Inspection services and Assist in Building Code Enforcement.

Mountain View Elementary school: We provide fire protection, Medical First Response and Rescue, Fire Prevention classes

Tigerville Elementary School: We provide fire protection, Medical First Response and Rescue, Fire Prevention classes

12 Tax Exempt Churches: We provide fire protection, Medical First Response and Rescue, Fire Inspection services and Assist in Building Code Enforcement.
