**Item (4) Request Approval of Relocation of Graves**

Kim Wunder, Assistant County Attorney addressed the Committee members with a request to relocate several unidentified graves in Southeastern Greenville County. She explained by Law, County Council is the authority which grants permission for the request. Ms. Wunder provided each member with a GIS map showing the location of the 55 acre track, close to I-85 and Pelham Road. She stated there were ten (10) graves on the property which were located by a surveyor. The graves appear to date back to the early 1800's. Ms. Wunder stated a representative of the property owner was here and available to answer any questions as well as Mr. Stovall who is a licensed Funeral Director and Consultant.

The representatives explained to the Committee the process and the attempt to locate any relatives of the deceased. A legal ad was run in the newspaper with no assistance in determining if there were any relatives. The intent would be to remove the graves, label them and place the remains in a concrete liner and rebury the graves in the new cemetery in the same configuration in which they were found.
