Staff Report	List of meetings with staff: none The subject parcel is 15.6 acres of property located on Grandview Drive approximately 0.4 miles southwest of the intersection of West Georgia Road and Interstate 385. The parcel has approximately 1,100 feet of frontage along Grandview Drive. The applicant is requesting to rezone the property to R-M16, Multifamily Residential. This residential district is established to provide for varying population densities. The principle use of land is for one-family, two-family, and multiple-family dwellings and recreational, religious, and educational facilities normally associated with residential development. The applicant states the proposed land use is for residential/ multifamily. The location is adjacent to an existing R-HI (Residential High Density) zoning (City of Simpsonville) that is developed as a multifamily residential complex. Also, with the exposure to the adjacent interstate, the site may have been equally or more suited for office use. It is staff's opinion that this requested rezoning would have minimal immediate impact to the character of the surrounding area. Based on these reasons, staff recommends approval of the request for R-M16, Multifamily Residential.
