## MEMORANDUM

**SUBJECT:** Acceptance of 0.835 miles (4,409 feet) of Hampton Avenue Extension

The County is managing a project to construct a pedestrian bridge on Hampton Avenue Extension, crossing multiple active railroad lines. This project has the full support of the surrounding community. In order to effectively manage the future maintenance of the bridge and subsequent connections to the Swamp Rabbit Trail, the County has asked SCDOT to abandon this portion of the roadway to the County. This will allow for much better management and oversight of the project and eliminates the need for third-party agreements throughout the design and construction process. SCDOT has agreed to the abandonment and is ready to proceed with the necessary paperwork.

This Division is requesting approval to accept the 4,409 feet of Hampton Avenue Extension (currently S-23-47) into the County's Inventory System in order to provide for future maintenance and oversight of the new bridge and connections.
