## 1.) Please describe the activity, function or project for which funding is requested.

The Historic Slater Hall Rehabilitation project aims to update the facility to maximize community use, improve physical appearance, and enhance functionality for special events. Built in 1934, Slater Hall has served the Slater-Marietta community for 84 years and counting. Public safety standards have improved while building conditions have deteriorated, requiring Greenville County to address several structural and aesthetic enhancements. This project will continue these efforts to rehabilitate the exterior of Historic Slater Hall, focusing on windows and porch columns. Slater Hall Community Center - 5 Whitney St, Slater, SC 2968

The success of the project will be measured by the increase use of the building for local events which draw visitors to Slater and offer recreation for the residents.

The Slater Hall Citizen's Committee has requested these improvements as priorities in recent community meetings and this grant funding will directly address their concerns.

Historic Slater Hall is the only public building available in the community to host special events like the recent Smithsonian Space Exhibit (space-suit fabric was created by Slater Mill), the annual Strawberry Festival, and annual Halloween Haunted House.

Historic and cultural tourism are popular activities in South Carolina. Slater Hall is among several facilities managed as historic sites by Greenville County Parks, Recreation, & Tourism in the Upstate, including Poinsett Bridge, Campbell's Covered Bridge, and Pleasant Ridge Park. Rehabilitating the Historic Slater Hall building will help define the location as a historic destination and a renewed point of community pride.

- The grantee must prepare a report to SCPRT within 90 days of the project completion.

- The report must reflect the actual revenues and expenditures compared to the project budget submitted with the application.
- Failure to comply with the above will result in the grantee being deemed as non-compliant by SCPRT. As a result, the grantee will be barred from receiving any grant funds administered by SCPRT until the issue is remedied. SCPRT currently administers the Tourism Advertising Grant, Parks and Recreation Development fund, Land and Water Conservation fund, Recreational Trails Program, Undiscovered SC Enhancement Grants, and the SC Sports Tourism Advertising and Recruitment grant program.
