# ANNEXATION OF PROPERTY INTO METROPOLITAN SEWER SUBDISTRICT – 148 COOPER LAKE ROAD

Kim Wunder, Assistant County Attorney addressed the Committee members with a request for annexation of property into Metropolitan Sewer Subdistrict. She stated the property was at 148 Cooper Lake Road, in District 27. The request was at the consent of the property owner and the request of Metropolitan Sewer. She stated this was a little different, from the usual annexation having to be contiguous to the service area. This property was close but not contiguous and falls in a unique situation. Ms. Wunder stated the woman who owns the property is not eligible for a septic permit from DHEC because she has access to public sewer.

Mr. Kirven stated he knew exactly where the property was because it is off of McKinney Road and he lives on the next road to the west, League Road. Horse Pen Creek also runs through his property. The property was adjacent to Dunwoody Oaks Subdivision, which has been served many years by a pump station. Mr. Kirven stated this case would need to be an exception to the standard county policy of being contiguous to the subdistrict.

**MOTION:** By Mr. Kirven to approve the annexation request of property into Metropolitan

Sewer Subdistrict located at 148 Cooper Lake Road as an exception and still keep the current policy in place. The motion carried unanimously by voice vote.
