RE: DONALDSON FIRE SERVICE AREA

Honorable Chairman Meadows and Greenville County Council:

Pursuant to the provisions of Title 4, Chapters 9 and 19 of the South Carolina Code and an ordinance enacted by the Greenville County (the "County") Council (the "Council") on April 6, 1982, as amended, the Council created the Donaldson Fire Service Area (the "Donaldson FSA") to provide fire protection services in and around the South Carolina Technology and Aviation Center, located in an unincorporated area of the County.

The Donaldson FSA's readiness and training meets a high standard for fire service provision. As a result, the Donaldson FSA's ISO rating is 2. The County's support of the Donaldson FSA has played a significant role in its strong ISO rating.

The Donaldson FSA continues to find the most cost-effective solutions to provide for increased compensation and operational costs, replacing outmoded equipment, and providing updated facilities. The Donaldson FSA plans to utilize the proceeds of the proposed approximate \$4,100,000 Greenville County, South Carolina, (Donaldson Fire Service Area Project), General Obligation Bond, Series 2022, ("GO 22") to replace and equip a 1991 pumper, repair and upgrade the existing station that was built in 1968, and add an addition to the station that will include new living quarters, office space, and conference rooms.

The current operating millage for the Donaldson FSA is 69.3 mils. In order to fund the debt service for the GO 22, a debt service millage increase of approximately 18 mills is necessary. The Donaldson Board of Commissioners understands the need to increase the debt service millage and has approved the request for the millage increase.

The Donaldson FSA is requesting that the County approve the issuance of the GO 22 and is also requesting a millage increase to fund the debt service for the GO 22.

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Attached you will find an update regarding the Donaldson Center Fire Department, the fire district millage request application and the preliminary GO 22 debt service analysis. Thank you very much for your continued support of the Donaldson FSA.

Donaldson Center Fire Department April 22, 2022

The Donaldson Center Fire Department (the "Department") provides fire and life safety for all the occupants of SCTAC. There are approximately 120 companies on South Carolina Technology and Aviation Corporation (SCTAC). Some of the services provided are fire protection, hazardous materials response, rescue services, emergency medical service, ARFF aircraft response, fire protection plans review and all levels of emergency response training and customized to the customer's needs.

The Department consists of two fire stations manned 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Personnel consists of 22 firefighters on two shifts as well as the fire Chief and Assistant Chief and 1 Office Manager.

The Department's vehicular equipment includes a

- 1. 1991 E-One 1500 gpm pumper
- 2. 2021 E-One Titan 6x6 ARFF vehicle
- 3. 2001 E-One 1500 gpm pumper
- 4. 2006 Ford F-550 Officer's quick response vehicle
- 5. 2019 Chevy Tahoe Assistant Chief
- 6. 2021 Chevy Tahoe Fire Chief
- 7. 2012 E-One Pumper 1500 gpm hale pumper
- 8. 2015 Chevrolet 2500 4x4 service truck

Additionally, the department has a wide assortment of specialized equipment, which enables it to carry out whatever task is at hand.

The personnel at DCFD are also integral part of the Greenville County Emergency Response Team.

The department's Fire Chief is Mark Pittman and the Board of Commission consists of members, Chairman- Ben Peats- Vice Chairman- Danny Moyd- Sec/Treas- Pat Holland and Member Grant Wooten and Phil Misklow.

In 2011, Greenville County (the "county") issued General Obligation Bonds, Series 2011B (the "GO2011B") on behalf of the Department for the acquisition of the 2012 E-One Pumper 1500 gpm hale pumper. The GO2011B was paid off in April 2017.

In 2019, Greenville County issued the General Obligation Bond, Series 2019B (the "GO2019B") for a 2020 E-One Titan 6X6 ARFF Vehicle, which replaced the 1994 E-One Titan 6x6 ARFF vehicle, which has reached its useful life. The GO 2019B will mature April 2026. No tax increase was requested.

On April 14, 2022, during the regular scheduled commission meeting, The Donaldson Center Fire Board of Commission voted and approved for DCFD to seek the issuance of a GO Bond 2022B in the amount of 4 million dollars, The funds will be used for several projects including

- Replacing the 1991 E-One Pumper and Equipment that is at the end of its service life
- Repairing and upgrading the existing building that was built in 1968
- Adding a new addition that will include new living quarters, office space and conference rooms.

The board of Commissions understands that there will be a need to increase the mileage to cover these expenses with the bond.

Lockheed Martin is the production sight for the F-16 Project bring Greenville County into aviation history. We also provide service to military units, including the Us Navy and Marines. SC National Guard and SC Army Reserves and Air Guard. We also provide service to Donaldson Career Center and Greenville Tech Aircraft Maintenance program. Each site with our district require different and unique firefighting services that require special equipment and training. Some our our industry uses volatile chemical and processes that creates dangerous situations that require extensive training and equipment.


