

HOME-ARP Program Overview

HOME-American Rescue Plan Program

- \$5 billion of supplemental HOME funds for assistance to homeless and other vulnerable populations, facilitating
 - Capital investment in permanent housing for thesepopulations
 - Upgrade available stock of shelter
 - o Provision of rental assistance or supportive services
- Allocated via HOME formula, highly targeted to poverty, renters in poverty, cost, availability and condition of housing stock
- Jurisdictions that qualified for HOME allocation in FY 2021will receive HOME-ARP allocation
 - Greenville County was allocated \$4,151,357 of HOME-ARP funding.

HOME-ARP Qualifying Populations

Funds must primarily benefit "qualifying populations"

- Homeless (McKinney Act definition)
- At-risk of homeless (McKinney Act definition)
- Fleeing/attempting to flee DV, dating violence, sexual violence, stalking, or human trafficking
- "Other Populations" where supportive services or assistance would <u>prevent the family's homelessness</u> orserve those with the <u>greatest risk of housing instability</u>
- Veterans and families that include a veteran member that meet one of the preceding criteria

HOME-ARP Eligible Activities

- Tenant-based rental assistance
- Development of affordable housing under HOME-ARP rules
- Supportive services, including-
 - Supportive service eligible under McKinney-Vento Act
 - Housing counseling
 - Homeless prevention services



- Acquisition/development of non-congregate shelter units
 - o Can be used in Emergency Shelter Grant Program
 - Eventual conversion to permanent housing possible

Other HOME-ARP Funding

- Up to 15% of HOME-ARP allocation may be used for administration and planning activities of Participating Jurisdiction or subrecipients
- Up to 5% of allocation to pay operating costs(e.g., salaries, insurance, utilities, etc.) for CHDOs and other nonprofits undertaking HOME-ARP activities
 - An additional 5% for capacity building costs, providing PJs an opportunity to expand capacity of CHDOs or other nonprofits

HOME-ARP Program Administration

- HOME-ARP will be implemented via CPD Notice
 - o Statutory suspension and alternative requirement authority for NAHA and McKinney Act
- PJs must develop and submit a "HOME-ARP Allocation Plan as substantial amendment to FY 2021Annual Action Plan
 - o PJs encouraged to begin community & provider consultations
 - Plans may not be submitted before Notice is issued
- Funds available for PJ expenditure until September 30,2030
