Re: CEPSCI Re-Certification

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is to inform you all that a majority of your CEPSCI certifications are set to expire on June 30, 2010. Per the Clemson CEPSCI website:

"Prior to the expiration date shown on CEPSCI identification cards, Certified Erosion Prevention and Sediment Control Inspectors are required by SC DHEC to complete a DHEC approved professional development training in order to be recertified."

Upon renewal, the CEPSCI Inspector will need to bring their **NEW** CEPSCI identification card to Greenville County's Land Development Division so that a copy can be made for our records. Please submit renewed cards to my attention. If the Land Development Division does not have a copy of the CEPSCI inspector's identification card on file at which time a grading permit is applied for and approved and/or upon submission of the Project Information Form, the grading permit will not be issued until documentation is received. Any inspector that does not participate in and successfully complete the CEPSCI re-certification will not be recognized as a CEPSCI inspector by Greenville County and therefore not be allowed to conduct third-party inspections on projects permitted through Greenville County's Land Development Division. Per SC DHEC, any intentional misrepresentation may result in declassification and possible legal action against the inspector and all parties involved.
