



## **“BULBS TO BAUBLES” ORNAMENTS**

### **Materials Needed: (Michael’s has everything!)**

- “Delta CeramDecor PermEnamel” Surface Conditioner
- “Delta CeramDecor PermEnamel” paints (your choice of colors)
- “Delta CeramDecor PermEnamel Glaze” (available in gloss and satin finish)
- Small paint brushes
- Craft wire, 24 gauge (available in a variety of colors)
- Assorted beads, buttons, sequins, etc. (can be as simple or as elaborate as you like)
- Burnt out light bulbs in any size or shape
- Wire cutters
- Needle-nose pliers (optional, very helpful working with wire)
- Glitter, puff paints (optional)

### **Instructions**

1. Designate place to hang ornaments to dry (ornaments shouldn’t touch each other or anything else).
2. Cut ten to twelve-inch piece of wire.
3. Wrap one end of wire around base of bulb and secure with a twist.
4. Place beads, buttons, etc. on the wire as preferred. To make a bead stay in place, loop the end of the wire back through the bead and pull through.
5. After beading wire, place unattached end next to metal base of bulb. Twist around base. To secure, twist end of wire around base of the wire to secure.
6. Brush on thin coat of surface conditioner with clean, dry brush. Let dry or wipe dry.
7. To paint bulb, hold it by wire or base, and using clean brush, apply paints to your liking. When using more than one color, let paint dry between coats. Depending on thickness/layers of paint, bulb generally dries in 30 minutes.
8. Once bulb dries, apply glaze topcoat, which sets paint. Allow bulb to dry for an hour.
9. After the topcoat dries, ornament is complete. If desired, add glitter, puff paint, sequins or other extras.
