- The day of the event, you will receive a coupon with instructions to place the order directly with the participating vendor of your choice. Discounted event prices include shipping and handling. There will not be mowers on site for sale.
- The \$100 trade-in rebate:
 - Has no cash value if you do not purchase a new mower.
 - Is limited to one per household.
 - Will be given on a first come, first served basis.
- You will have until May 31, 2011, to purchase mowers and use the \$100 trade-in rebate.
- Proof of Greenville County residency is required (Driver's License) — Including municipalities and unincorporated areas
- You do not need to drain the fuel from your trade-in mower.
- **No Trade-in? No problem!** You can still purchase a mower at the discounted event price until May 31, 2011!

- No gas or oil required.
- Low maintenance. No annual tune ups required.
- Cost effective — charge battery vs. purchasing fuel.

Composting

Composting is controlling the natural decay of organic matter by providing the right conditions for composting critters to convert yard trimmings and kitchen scraps into a product that can be returned to your garden. The final product is a dark, crumbly form of decomposed organic matter that may be used as a soil amendment.

Compost Recipe

You will need brown materials high in carbon such as leaves, straw, and sawdust and green materials high in nitrogen such as grass clippings and fruit and vegetable scraps. You can also add egg shells and coffee filters. You will also need water and air to create the perfect environment to make compost.
