I, J. W. Gray, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETING:  
WHEREAS, B. M. Sims & Co.

on or about the 2nd day of September in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirteen exhibited his complaint in the Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against William Sims, Louise Sims and Belton Sims, f.

demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 6th day of December 1913, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be sold by J. W. Gray, Master in and for the County aforesaid, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the said decree as by reference thereto on file in said Court will appear; and the Master, after having duly advertised the said real estate for sale by public outcry on the 5th day of January in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and fourteen did then openly and publicly, according to the custom of auction, sell and dispose of the same unto William Sims,

for the sum of fourteen hundred and fifteen Dollars, being at that price the highest bidder therefor.  
NOW, THEREFORE, Know all men by these Presents, that I, J. W. Gray, Master in and for County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of fourteen hundred and fifteen Dollars, to me paid by the said William Sims,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said William Sims, all that piece, parcel and tract of land situate in County and State aforesaid, containing one hundred and eighteen acres, more or less, and bounded by lands of Belton Sims, Newton Sims and C. S. Hunt, and being the same tract of land conveyed to William Sims by Hewlett Sullivan, by deed bearing date the 9th of July, 1880, and recorded in T. M. C. office in Book K K, page 577, less 2 2/3 acres, sold therefrom by J. W. Gray, Master, to Belton Sims, Jr., on Salesday in January, 1914, the original tract so conveyed to said William Sims, containing 140 acres, more or less.

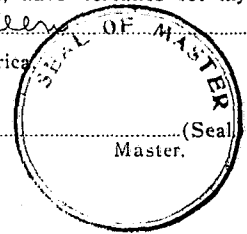
