to me paid by the said Maude Pike

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Maude Pike, the said life estate of Garrison Edwards in that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, lying and being in the State and County aforesaid, and having the following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning at R.O.; thence S. 62 W. 6.50 to stake on Spain Creek; thence S. 23-1/2 W. 6.94 to stone; thence S. 27 E. 20.75 to stone; thence N. 58-1/2 E. 8.75 to stone; thence S. 54-1/2 E. 2.00 to a poplar tree; thence N. 44-1/2 E. 34.00 to a black oak (down) thence N. 62-1/2 E. 7.50 to a P.O. stump; thence N. 88-1/4 W. 39.80 to a stake; thence S. 3 W. 5.00 to beginning corner, containing 83 acres, more or less.
