NOW, THEREFORE, Know all men by these Presents, that I, E. Inman Master in and for County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One hundred Dollars, to me paid by the said Henry P. McGehee

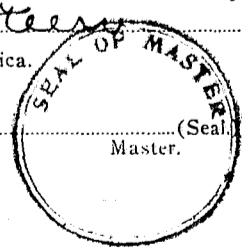
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Henry P. McGehee, the following described real estate, All that piece, parcel and lot of land situated lying and being in the County of Greenville, State aforesaid, near the corporate limits of the City of Greenville and being a portion of the City Trust property, to wit: Beginning at a stake at corner of Summit Street and McD. Avenue and running thence in Westernly direction with Summit Street 80 feet to a stake on Hunt Street; thence with Hunt Street in Southernly direction 100 feet to a stake joint corner of lots 123 and 124. Thence with joint lines of said lots 98 feet to a stake on McD. Avenue; thence with said Street in Northernly direction 100 feet to the beginning corner, and being known as lot no. 123, according to a plat made by W. B. Adams and recorded in Plat Book in the P. M. C. office for Greenville County. This being the same lot of land conveyed to A. Schouretter by W. J. Henderson, H. W. Hunt and J. W. Hunt by deed bearing date May 27th, 1913.
