the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT bargain, sell and release unto the said Martha Banks the following described real estate, to-wit: all that certain piece, parcel and lot of land situated, lying and being in Ward one of the City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, on Bull's Alley and containing nine one-hundredths of an acre more or less, having a frontage of thirty-five feet and nine inches on Bull's Alley and more fully described in the deed from Alastair J. Furman to Charlie and Mattie Simpson of date April 22nd. 1901, and recorded in the P. M. C. Office for said County and State in Volume 13, page 91.

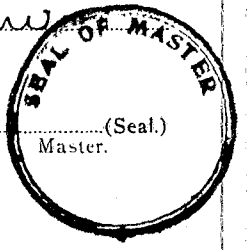
