is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said

L. J. Jennings All those four certain lots of land, situate in the  
 first Ward of the City of Greenville North of Frank Street and West of Hampton  
 Avenue, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:—Beginning at an  
 iron pin on line of property now, or formerly of the Southern Railway Company,  
 corner of lot No. 10, and running thence with line of lot No. 10 N. 8° E.  
 one hundred and twenty (120) feet to iron pin in line of lot No. 8 property  
 of Ed and Anna Rose; thence with line of lot No. 8 N. 3° W. fifty (50) feet to  
 iron pin in line of lot No. 19; thence with line common to lots 8 and 12  
 B. 8° E. sixty-four (64) feet to iron pin on ten foot alley; thence with said  
 ten foot alley N. 32° 25' W. one hundred eighty-seven (187) feet to an iron pin;  
 thence S. 57° 35' W. one hundred eight and five-tenths (108.5) feet to R.R.  
 iron in line of property of Southern Railway; thence with line of said  
 Railway Company S. 3° E. one hundred fifty-nine (159) feet to the beginning  
 corner; being known and designated as lots 11, 12, 13 and 14, as shown on  
 Plot recorded in R.M.C. office for Greenville County in Plot Book C, page 43 and  
 also, all that certain lot of land situate on the West side of Laurens  
 Street in the Third Ward of the City of Greenville, County of Greenville and State  
 of South Carolina, on which is situate the brick building known as  
 the Lower Stable, and having the following metes and bounds to-wit:—Be-  
 ginning on Laurens Street, corner of Congress & Lower, being the Northeast corner  
 of the said brick stable, and running thence with the outer edge of the northern  
 wall of said brick stable in a westerly direction, being parallel with Washington  
 Street one hundred (100) feet; thence in a southerly direction parallel with Laurens  
 Street sixty (60) feet, more or less, to line of W. B. Harrison; thence along  
 the outer edge of the southern wall of the said brick stable, being parallel with  
 Washington Street one hundred (100) feet to Laurens Street; thence with said  
 Laurens Street in a northerly direction sixty (60) feet, more or less, to the beginning  
 corner.
