KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Greenville Trust Company, as Trustee

a corporation chartered under the laws of the State of South Carolina and having its principal place of business at Greenville in the State of South Carolina for and in consideration of the sum of Five thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars, and other good and valuable considerations...

A. Abraham, his heirs and assigns, all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, in the County of Greenville, and in the City of Greenville, on the West side of South Main Street, and being known and designated as lot No. 2, on a plat made by F.G. Rogers, Architect, and recorded in Plat Book C. at page 49 in the R.M.C. Office for said State and County, and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning at a stake on the west side of South Main Street, at joint corners of lots No. 1 and 2 and running thence along said Street N. 35°-55' E. 21'-0" to a stake at joint corner of lots No. 2 and 3; thence along joint line of lots No. 2 and 3, N. 58° 05' W. 36'-0" to a corner; thence along a line parallel with South Main Street S. 35°-55' W. 21'-0" to a stake at joint corner of lots No. 1 and 2; thence along joint line of lots No. 1 and 2, S. 58°-05' E. 36'-4" to the beginning corner on South Main Street. This being a part of the same land conveyed to Greenville Trust Company, as Trustee by American Pipe and Construction Company by a deed bearing date the 24th. day of September 1912, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for said State and County in Deed Book Vol. 12, at page 470. This deed is made subject to the rights and easements conveyed by the American Pipe and Construction Company to The Paris Mountain Water Company in a right of way recorded in the R.M.C. Office in Deed Book Vol. 12, at page 462.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the premises before mentioned unto the grantee...hereinabove named, and his heirs and assigns forever.

And the said granting corporation does hereby bind itself and its successors to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the grantee... hereinabove named, and his heirs and assigns, against itself and its successors, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

In witness whereof the said granting corporation has caused its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed and these presents to be subscribed by its duly authorized officers, C.C. Good, President and Treasurer and J. Frank Eppes, Secty. on this the 16th day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen (1913), and in the one hundred and thirty-seventh year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
