NOW, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That,

I, O. L. V. Thomason

in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars and other good and valuable DOLLARS,
to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Blanche Neely

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these Presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said Blanche Neely, all my undivided one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) interest in and to a certain tract of land conveyed to me by O. L. V. Thomason, Master for Greenville County, by deed dated January 19, 1897, duly recorded in the Register of Deeds Office for said State and County, in Vol. 77 R. page 61. This tract of land contains eighty (80) acres, more or less, and has the following metes and bounds to wit: "Beginning on branch on creek 3 x and thence S. 68° 3.66 to stone on Gully; thence with Gully S. 48° 19.40 to pine, 3 x, thence S. 15° 5' E. 7.65 to stone on road; thence S. 49° W. 7.85 to stone; thence S. 83 $\frac{3}{4}$ W. 7.97 to stone; thence S. 43 $\frac{3}{4}$ W. 5.17 to stone; thence S. 69 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 2.30; thence N. 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. subject to changes made by my agent P. J. Mead, et al! Trustee of Peigah M. C. Church, S. on the 7th day of April, 1904, in which one-fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) acre was exchanged, and thence N. 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 34.00 to stone; thence N. 28° E. 18.40 to stone on branch; thence the branch line to beginning corner and bounded by lands of J. C. Terry, C. T. Thompson, Mrs. Elmer Gilstrap and others.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned unto the said Blanche Neely for and during the term of her natural life, and at her death to go to her children, heirs and assigns, forever.

AND I do hereby bind myself and my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said Blanche Neely for life and after death to her children and their heirs and assigns, against myself and my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
