Peterkin), (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Julia M. Peterkin, her heirs and assigns forever, All of that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, about three and one-half miles from Greenville Court House, near the White Oak Church Road, in Butler, Paris Mountain, and Chick Springs Townships, on head waters of Richland Creek, and having the following metes and bounds according to a plat of same made by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, dated June, 1922; Beginning at a stake in the center of a road separating this land from lands formerly of K. J.
