EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT. WHEREAS, L. S. Hand, Fannie B. Hand and D. W. Westmoreland, all of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 24th day of January, 1922, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given. SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Dixie Furniture Co.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is Selling furniture and other household furniture for cash and on installment payments.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. Banks Dove, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

did on the 2nd day of February, 1922, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given. SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is The Industrial Loan and Investment Corporation of Greenville, S.C.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to do a general savings and loan business and to lend its funds to members of the industrial and working classes accepting such instruments known to law for the purpose of securing the same and to lend to other persons not members thereof nor shareholders therein in manner provided by its by-laws. The said corporation to have the power to borrow money and to execute instruments known to law for the purpose of securing the same. To sue and be sued. To contract and be contracted with.
