Bassett, all that lot of land in the City of Greenville, County and state aforesaid containing acre or more and bounded by lands of Margaret Johnson, J. G. Davis and A. C. Davis each containing one-half acre, more or less, and having thereon a dwelling house.

The purpose of this deed is to vest the title in those persons mentioned in the decree in the case of William Donald, Jr., George Donald, William Donald, Walter Donald, James H. Donald Plaintiff against James Moore, Peretta O'Neckin, Martha Donald, Beulah Donald and Robert Donald defendants, and to ratify and confirm the title in those parties mentioned in the decree and as provided in said decree in the case above mentioned.

This deed is a quit-claim deed and is made for no other purpose than to disclaim any title in myself and to vest the title as provided in the decree in the above mentioned case.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.  
TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned, unto the said E. L. Bassett, Master, his heirs and assigns, forever.

AND I, P. G. Davis, do hereby bind myself and my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said E. L. Bassett, Master, his heirs and assigns, against myself my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
