All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Paris Mountain Township, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, on the south side of a road leading from Curwens Road to Bear School, known as Dolphin Spring Road, containing thirty-seven (37) acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, according to a plat made by M. Furman, Esq. on Aug. 17th, 1923.
