WHEREAS, W. W. Workman, and H. W. Estes, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 16th day of February, 1927, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is: Riverside Heights Corporation
THIRD: That the principal place of business is: Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is: to buy, sell, trade, improve, subdivide, mortgage and handle real estate in such manner and with such powers as are ordinarily vested in and incident to a real estate business.

did on the 31st day of February, 1927, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is: Farmers Agricultural Credit Corporation
THIRD: That the principal place of business is: Greenville, S. C.
