I, E. Insman

Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETING:

Whereas, H. L. Crumley, G. R. Crumley and M. M. Crumley

on or about the 6th day of July in the year of
our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty seven exhibited their complaint in the
Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against Lottie H. Crumley, individually, and

as Administratrix of the estate of R. C. Crumley, deceased,
et al.

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 13th
day of July 1937, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was

adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. Insman
Master in and for the County aforesaid, to H. L. Crumley, G. R. Crumley and M. M. Crumley
for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; (See Judgment Roll No. E-6522)

NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. Insman
Master, in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree.

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said H. L. Crumley, G. R.

Crumley and M. M. Crumley, all the right, title and
interest of Lottie H. Crumley, Winifred S. Crumley and
Morris Crumley, the same being an undivided one-fourth
(1/4) interest in and to the following described real estate:

"All that parcel or tract of land containing 16.2 acres,
more or less, situate, lying and being in Greenville
County, on both sides of Wolf Creek, a branch of Enoree
River, beginning on the south side of said creek on a
pine 3x; thence N. 5 E. 26.50 chs. to stake on Jenkins line;
thence N. 61 E. 42.75 to a red or black oak 3x; thence S.
25 E. 15.50 to a post oak 3x; thence due east to Enoree River
29.50; thence down said River to Wolf Creek; thence up
said Creek to the mouth of a small branch to white
oak tree 3x; thence S. 71 W. 45.25 on land of Jacobs to a
hickory stump; thence Southwest to the beginning corner;
being the same tract of land conveyed to W. C. Crumley
by Dr. B. H. Few by deed dated October 27, 1902, and re-
corded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Book of
Deeds "000" at page 737.

All that piece, parcel and lot of land, in the State and
County aforesaid, containing 16 acres, more or less, according
to a survey made by W. A. Hester, D. S., November 23, 1908,
and having the following meter and bounds, to-wit:

thence up said River 4.10 chs. to seven bark oak at road;
thence with said road N. 75 1/2 W. 8.50 chs. to water oak;
thence N. 74 1/2 W. 1.50 chs; thence N. 32 1/4 W. 2.50 chs; thence
N. 88 1/2 W. 4.00 chs; thence N. 76 W. 7.00 chs; thence S. 76 W. 3.50
chs; thence N. 81 W. 4.00 chs; thence leaving road S. 20 1/2 E.
7 1/2 chs. to stone; thence S. 86 1/2 E. 30.30 chs. to stake on bank
of Enoree River, adjoining lands of W. C. Crumley, B. M. Wood, et al.
being the same tract of land conveyed to W. C. Crumley by
Emma Crumley, Laurence Crumley, Elda May Crumley, Leland
Crumley, Thomas B. Crumley, known as Doodle Crumley, heirs
at law of Thomas Crumley by deed dated Feb. 1919
