all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville, Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

In Ward Six of the City of Greenville, on the southwest corner of Glenn Street, and St. John Street, and having the following metes and bounds, to wit;

Beginning at an iron pin at the southwest corner of Glenn Street, and St. John Street, and running thence along the line of St. John Street, N. 78 W. 46.6 feet to the line of the lot now or formerly belonging to Stsie F. Reed; thence along the line of that lot S. 12 W. 79.5 feet to the corner of a lot belonging to H. E. Batson, thence along the line of that lot S. 78 E. 46.6 feet to an iron pin on Glenn Street; thence along the line of Glenn Street, N. 12 E. 79.4 feet to the beginning corner, being designated as lot No. 12 of Block 4, as shown on the Greenville City Block Book at page 87, and being a portion of the lot conveyed to Susan Harrison by Hannah J.
