EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.

WHEREAS, R. L. Mitchell, R. C. Hurd, and Peirce Van Vleck, all of Spartanburg, S. C.

did on the 10th day of March, 1930, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Petroleum Co.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is buy and sell petroleum products, wholesale and retail. Build, rent, buy or sell filling or bulk stations for petroleum products. Operate by lease or ownership trucks, automobiles and tank cars.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty five Thousand (\$25,000.00)

Preferred Stock of the par value of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars per share, payable in cash or property of the value thereof, and five hundred (500) shares of Common Stock of no par value.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Two Hundred and Fifty (250) Preferred of the par value of one hundred (\$100.00); and Five Hundred (500) Common Stock without par value.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 3rd day of March, 1930, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

R. L. Mitchell, R. C. Hurd and Peirce Van Vleck.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Peirce Van Vleck as Vice-President, R. C. Hurd; as Secretary, R. L. Mitchell as Treasurer, R. L. Mitchell

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter L, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Daily News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
