BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.

WHEREAS, Van B. White and L. J. Forrester, both of  
Greenville, S. C.

did on the 5th day of May, 1933, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Auto Sales, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is  
to buy, sell, trade, finance and generally deal in automobiles, trucks, tractors, parts  
and accessories, and to do all things necessary or incident to the operation of an automobile  
business, wholesale and retail, and to have all powers usually conferred upon similar  
corporations.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten Thousand (\$10000.00)  
Dollars,  
payable in cash and property.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred (100)  
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 28th day of April, 1933,  
at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:  
Van B. White, L. J. Forrester and D. S. McClain,

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President D. S. McClain,  
as Vice-President, Van B. White, as Secretary, L. J. Forrester,  
as Treasurer, L. J. Forrester.

NINTH: That all requirements of ~~xxxxx~~ Chapter 153 Article 2 / Code of Laws of the Civil Code of South Carolina, ~~xxx~~ 1932,  
and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona  
fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration  
with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News  
a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the  
authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the  
laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under  
their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court  
in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
