WHEREAS, George F. Shadid and Fred Shadid, both of Greenville S.C. and Joseph Shadid of Charleston, S.C.

did on the 18th day of August, 1933, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Linda Shop Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is To purchase or otherwise acquire, own, mortgage, pledge, sell and assign and transfer, or otherwise dispose of, to invest, trade, deal in and deal with, goods, wares and merchandise and real and personal property of every class and description. To have one or more offices to carry on all or any of its operations and business and with out restriction or limit as to amount to purchase or otherwise acquire, hold own, mortgage, sell, convey or otherwise dispose of real and personal property of every class and description in any of the States, Districts, Territories or Colonies of the United States, and in, buy and all foreign Countries subject to the laws of such State, District, Territory, Colony or Country. In general to carry on any other business in connection with the foregoing, whether manufacturing or otherwise, and to have and exercise all the powers conferred by the laws of South Carolina upon corporations formed under the Act referred to, and to do any or all of the things herein before set forth to the same extent as natural persons might or could do. The foregoing clauses shall be construed both as objects and powers; and it is hereby expressly provided that the foregoing enumeration or specific powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers of this corporation.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five Thousand (\$5,000.00)

payable at the call of the Treasurer Dollars,

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is fifty (50) of the par value of One hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 17th day of August, 1933, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

George F. Shadid, Fred Shadid and Joseph Shadid

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President George F. Shadid as Vice-President, Fred Shadid; as Secretary, Joseph Shadid as Treasurer, George F. Shadid

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 153 Article 2 of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, 1932 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W.P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
