KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, John C. Fisher, of Greenville County,

One Dollar and love and affection.

In the State aforesaid,
in consideration of the sum of
XX DOLLARSIn hand paid
to me
at and before the sealing of these presents by William J. Fisher, of Greenville County.

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Graunt, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

William J. Fisher, his heirs and assigns:

A certain tract or parcel of land in Glassy Mountain Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, bounded on the North by land this day conveyed by John C. Fisher to Archie L. Durham; on the East by Lake Lanier Company and Estate of Warren Fisher; on the South by Estate of Warren Fisher, and on the West by remaining lands of John C. Fisher, and is more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a pine, an established corner and the corner of Lake Lanier company and Estate of Warren Fisher, which pine bears South 30 deg. East 30 feet from the corner of a tract this day by John C. Fisher to Archie L. Durham, and runs from said pin North 30 deg. West 20 feet to the center of the road, Durham's corner; thence with said road and Durham's line the following calls; South 70 deg. West 180 feet; thence North 73 $\frac{1}{2}$ deg. West 200 feet; North 40 deg. West 140 feet; North 73 $\frac{1}{2}$ deg. West 200 feet; North 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ deg. West 90 feet; North 41 $\frac{1}{2}$ deg. West 50 feet; North 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet West 100 feet; North 71 $\frac{1}{2}$ deg. West 180 feet to a stake; (Note - two calls are with the old road but extend beyond Durham's line); thence South 430 feet to a stake in the old road; thence with the old road and the original John C. Fisher-Warren Fisher line to the place of beginning.

The above is a part of the tract of land devised to John C. Fisher by the will of Mary L. Carruth, which will is of record in Polk County, N. C., and Greenville County, S.C.

This deed is not to be taken as an advancement to my son, William J. Fisher, and the entire consideration is love and affection.
