

State of South Carolina : Deed of Custody of minors and Separation  
 County of Greenville : Agreement  
 This Agreement entered into this 15th day of May, 1936 between  
 John B. McLemore, Jr., of the first part and Beatrice Poole Mc-  
 Lemore of the second part both of and in the County and State  
 aforesaid is as follows:

1. Said parties having married in this State on July 15, 1932 mutually agree to a separation of each other their separation from bed and board, and each mutually agrees in consideration of these premises that the other is here after forever discharged from the duties arising from such marriage relation;
2. The party of the second part agrees to convey and do hereby grant and convey to the party of the first part all her rights to the custody, control and services of their infant child, Billy Harlon McLemore, their only child, to have and to hold to him his heirs and assigns forever;
3. And the said party of the first part hereby agrees to care for, rear and educate the said child fit the best of his ability, and is to be freed from any liability to contribute in any way to the support of the said party of the second part.

 misess herein made and the mutual discharge of obligation
