 that I, George Parker, unmarried, of the City, County
 and State of New York, in consideration of the sum
 of Two Thousand and four hundred dollars and the conve-
 nience to me it would post and stand before the
 sealing of these presents, by National Bankholders
 Corporation, a corporation duly organized and
 qualified under and by virtue of the Laws of the
 State of Delaware, having an office and place of bus-
 iness at 4790 West St. New York, New York, the receipt
 whereof I hereby acknowledge, have granted,
 bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents
 to a front, to agree, sell and convey unto the National
 Bankholders Corporation, the following described
 real estate.

Situate in the County of Greenville, State
 of South Carolina. All that certain lot or portion
 of land situated, lying and being in the
 City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, on
 the North side of South Main Street, and being
 described and designated as Lots Nos. 13, 14, 15,
 25, 26, and 27 as shown on a plat recorded in
 the Office for Greenville County in
 Plat Book C, page 156, and having, according
 to a survey made by Ballou & Phillips, Esq., A.D.
 1927, the following dimensions, boundaries, features,
 beginning at a point on the north side
 of South Main Street which point is 130
 feet east of the North East corner of Main and
 Cedar Streets and is the south east corner of a
 brick wall and running thence along the entire
 front of the building on Main Street for 138.6 feet to a point
 near main pier, thence 29.11 to 138.6 feet to a point
 on South Main Street, and running
 west of a brick wall, and going back of Lot
 Nos. 13, 25, and 27 three plumb feet to the beginning
 of Main Street, 38.5-01 ft. to the beginning
 corner. Together with the right to let to the
 brick wall of S. L. Bee's building to the west
 of the above described property, and the fur-
 ther right to raise and wage an audience
 or concert house of S. L. Bee to T. H. Fair, dated
