in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said J. L. Greenway and all my right, title and interest,

of and unto all that piece, parcel or lot of land in brick spring Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on Mountain Creek, containing 90 acres, more or less, being a part of the Robert Gibson tract, bounded by lands now or formerly of Joe Edwards and tracts 2, 3 & 4, and lands now or formerly of H. M. Shockey and having the following metes and bounds: Beginning at a stone in the Greenville Roads near a graveyard, and running thence S. 89° 21' 9.38 to bend in road, thence S. 77° 13' W. 7.38 to bend in road, thence S. 74° 21' 16.78 to stone in the road, thence North 9° 5' E. 10.05 to stone (B gun-gone), thence North 74° E. 6.79 to stone o.m.; thence N. 29° 13' 38'. 7.30 to stone, o.m.; thence N. 35° 11' 21' 12.19 to stone o.m.; thence N. 61° 34' E. 31.41 to pine knot o.m.; thence S. 64° 2' E. 3.85 to pine knot o.m.; thence N. 66° 2' E. 12.62 to N.O. stump o.m.; thence S. 81° 2' E. 4.33 to dogwood on bank of creek; thence up the creek to a poplar tree o.m. on south side of Creek near the ford, thence S. 40° E. 3.07 to bend in the road; thence S. 76° E. 5.40 to bend in the road, thence S. 26° E. 3.83 to bend in the road, thence S. 35° W. 2.50 to bend in the road, thence S. 3° E. 15.08 to the beginning corner.

It is understood that one fourth of an acre, where the graveyard is, is reserved for a family burying ground.
