SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Wilson Bonded Warehouse
Company, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is operate a public and
private warehouse for the storage of cotton and other
commodities, and to do any and all things
incidental to the carrying on of said business,
and generally to transact all business as may be
permitted under the existing law, or which may
hereafter be conferred upon such corporations
by law.

Dollars,
payable in cash or property at the call of the directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is two hundred (200)
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, H. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the
authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the
laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under
their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court
in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
