WHEREAS, W. H. Rice, and H. M. Bethea, both of
Greenville, S. C.

did on the 5th day of October, 1934, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Palmetto Collection Service, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is a general collection of past due accounts and all things necessary and incident thereto, to make contracts, to loan money, to acquire and to transfer property, both real and personal, including shares of stock in other corporations.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars,
 payable in cash or the equivalent thereof

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Ten (10)
 of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 14th day of August, 1934, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:
W. H. Rice and H. M. Bethea

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President W. H. Rice
 as Vice-President, H. M. Bethea; as Secretary, H. M. Bethea
 as Treasurer, W. H. Rice,

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Daily News,
 a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
