SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is _____

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is General finance business, specifically including the making of loans, purchase, sale and exchange of notes, mortgages, and other forms of indebtedness, to accept security by way of mortgage or otherwise on loans and other transactions, and the purchase, sale and exchange of real estate.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five thousand (\$5,000.00)

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is fifty (50)

of the par value of One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 15th day of December 1934, 193____, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:
N. A. Hack and Gladys Greene Hack

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President N. A. Hack
as Vice-President, Gladys Greene Hack; as Secretary, Gladys Green Hack
as Treasurer, N. A. Hack,

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in _____

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
