WHEREAS, John W. Arrington of Greenville, S.C. and John R. Hast of York, S.C.

did on the 4th day of September, 1935, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Palmetto Print Works.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to bleach, dye, print, finish and treat in any other manner, manufacture, buy, sell and deal in cotton, silk, rayon, wool and any other material, and the goods made therefrom, and the products thereof in any form; to construct, acquire, maintain and operate mills, factories, warehouses and structures and appliances required in the operation of said business, and to acquire, hold and deal in stocks, bonds, securities or other evidences of indebtedness of other corporations.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars,  
payable Twenty (20%) per cent in cash and balance at call of Directors

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is five thousand (5,000)  
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 3rd day of September, 1935, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

J. W. Arrington, J. W. Arrington, Jr., R. W. Arrington, W. A. Broadfoot, P. A. Johnson, and John R. Hast

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President P. A. Johnson  
as Vice-President, R. W. Arrington; as Secretary, W. B. Arrington  
as Treasurer, J. W. Arrington, Jr.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
