WHEREAS, G. M. Moisson, Greenville, S. C., and  
H. S. Williams, Sasley, S. C.

did on the 4th day of November, 1935, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Moisture-Proof Container Company,

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is the manufacture and sale, both wholesale and retail, of specially and generally designed and constructed moisture proof containers for salt and condiments of all kinds, both filled and empty, and do and perform all matters necessary and incident to the operation of such business and the business of corporations generally.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Three thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars,  
payable twenty per cent on subscription and balance at call of Directors

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is thirty (30)  
of the par value of One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 29th day of October, 1935, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:  
G. M. Moisson, H. S. Williams, Dr. V. P. Bell, C. H. Gorman, and T. E. Esken.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President G. M. Moisson,  
as Vice-President, H. S. Williams, ; as Secretary, I. C. Moisson  
as Treasurer, G. M. Moisson

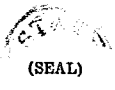
NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

Greenville Piedmont,

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
