EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, D. L. Scurry and A. B. Turnbull, both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 29th day of July 1935, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is *W. J. F. Fertilizer Company*

THIRD: That the proposed office of business is *Greenville, S.C.*

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is *to make loans on personal and real property, to buy, sell, hold or mortgage personal and or real property, and to do such things in connection therewith as are proper and as provided for by statutes as now in force or as hereafter amended.*

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is *Five Hundred (\$500.00)*

payable *in cash at organization meeting*

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is *Five (5)* of the par value of *One Hundred (\$100.00)* Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the *22nd* day of *July*, 1935 at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: *D. L. Scurry and A. B. Turnbull*

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President *D. L. Scurry* as Vice-President, *A. B. Turnbull*; as Secretary, *A. B. Turnbull* as Treasurer, *D. L. Scurry*

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

The Observer a newspaper published in the County of *Greenville*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, *W. P. Blackwell*, Secretary of State, by virtue of authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
