Know All Men By These Presents:

That the American Surety Company of New York, a corporation of the State of New York, of No. 100 Broadway, in the City of New York, in said State, has made, constituted, and appointed, and by these presents does hereby make, constitute and appoint Charles E. Robinson, of Greenville, Greenville County, South Carolina, its true, sufficient and lawful attorney, with full power and authority to make, execute, attach its corporate seal thereto, and deliver, for it, in its name and in its behalf, as surety at Greenville, aforesaid, bonds, undertakings, or obligations as follows:

Bonds, not exceeding in any single instance Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), conditioned for the faithful performance of their duties by Executors, Administrators, Receivers in State and Federal Courts (excepting Trustees and Receivers under State Insolvency Laws and Assignees for the benefit of Creditors), and Receivers and Trustees in Bankruptcy;

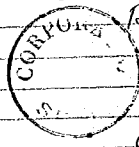
Bonds, not exceeding in any single instance, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000), on Plaintiffs' Attachment, on Plaintiffs' Garnishment, and Cost; required to be filed in the County of Greenville State of South Carolina, hereby giving its said attorney full power and authority to do everything whatsoever requisite and necessary to be done for the purpose of making, executing and delivering such obligations as fully as the officers of said American Surety Company of New York could do if personally present, and hereby ratifying and confirming all that its said attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue hereof, but reserving to itself full power of substitution and revocation.

In Witness Whereof, the said American Surety Company of New York has caused its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed and these presents to be duly executed by its proper officers at the City of New York on this 18th day of May, 1936.

At a regular meeting of the Executive Committee of the American Surety Company of New York, held at the office of the Company at No. 100 Broadway, in the City of New York, on the seventh day of May, 1902, the following resolution was adopted:

"Resolved, That the President, or one of the Vice Presidents, and the Secretary, or one of the Assistant Secretaries, or one of the Attorneys, be and they hereby are authorized and empowered to make, execute and deliver in behalf of the Company, unto such person or persons as they may from time to time select, its power of attorney constituting and appointing each such person its Attorney in Fact, with full power and authority to make, execute, attach its corporate seal
