the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Fred M. Drammell

"All that certain piece, parcel and lot of land lying, being and situate in Greenville County, in the State of South Carolina, as follows; to-wit: Being known and designated as Lots Nos. 39 and 40 on that subdivision known as "M. Cullough Heights" as shown on plat of said property recorded in the office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County, in Plat Book 6, Page 15."
