in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and release, unto the said Evie Gosnell Owings, all my right, title and interest, the same being a one-half undivided interest in and to, all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in Ward 4, City of Greenville, and having the following metes and bounds, according to plat made by R. C. Dalton, Engineer:

Beginning at a fence post on the north side of Webster Street, and running thence North 22.42 E. 34.5 feet to a stake in outhouse; thence North 44.15 East 67.5 feet to iron pin; thence North 67.30 West 71.2 feet to a stake; thence South 20.12 West 117 feet, more or less to Webster Street; thence with Webster Street South 69.48 East 40.1 feet to the beginning corner.
