All that piece, parcel or tracts of land situate, lying and being in Assata Township, county and state aforesaid and being known and designated as track No. 4 on plat of Nannie H. White property made by A. F. Riddle dated March 1936 and more fully described as follows:

Beginning at a stake point corner of tracks nos. 1 and 3 running thence N. 38-00 W. 2220 feet to a cluster of white oaks thence N. 04-45 E. 375 feet to a sweet gum thence N. 12-10 E. 541 feet to a stake thence N. 85-45 E. 406 feet to a stake thence N. 13-10 W. 327 feet to a stake thence N. 67-45 E. 270 feet to a stone thence S. 64-45 E. 175 feet to a stake at the creek near the mouth of a branch running thence up said branch as the line S. 9-30 E. 400 feet to a bend thence S. 9-30 W. 332 feet to a bend thence S. 23-45 E. 204 feet to a bend thence S. 41-30 E. 838 feet to a bend thence S. 50 E. 210 feet to an iron pin thence S. 41 E. 175 to a poplar stump thence S. 20-30 E. 102 feet to a stake thence S. 56-30 W. 853 feet to the beginning corner and containing 30.60 acres more or less.
